Hagerstown Police Urge Public to Get the See Something, Send Something App

The Hagerstown Police Department has released a new free app for people to communicate with them directly.

The Hagerstown Police Department has chosen to implement the See Something, Send Something app to supplement their crime fighting efforts. An excerpt from the agency's website says "A new, free app called See Something Send Something is increasing the ability for law enforcement to more effectively communicate with the public and also allows citizens to easily communicate and send information to law enforcement."



The smart device apps allows law enforcement to set up invisible geofence broadcast notifications that alert community member's smart devices with pertinent information. After receiving information or as part of proactive empowerment, app users can submit tips with pictures, videos or attachments.

"We're a 112-man strong police department. The community is our 113th man," Captain Paul Kifer with the Hagerstown Police Department.
